
TEACHING NOTES: Meadow & Marley's Magical Mix

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
EDUCATIONAL APPLICABILITY

Meadow & Marley's Magical Mix is a personal story, and the author wants to empower and build pride in children from a mixed background. This book is perfect for children and their parents who will all benefit from being equipped to face regular curiosity about where they are 'from'. Food is cleverly used in the story to help children recognise the beauty of understanding and belonging to multiple parts of the world.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

Read the book together, asking questions throughout.

- I. Look at the cover of the book together. What do you think the story might be about?
- 2. Whether teacher or parent, discuss the concept of mixed backgrounds with the children/child.
- 3. How many people do they know of mixed backgrounds? Talk about the different cultures and countries. Do they know about their backgrounds?
- 4. What were Meadow and Marley trying to find out?
- 5. Have they ever been to a market before? In what country? What did they buy? What different foods have they eaten?
- 6. What did Meadow and Marley find out in the end?
- 7. What did the children think of the book? If they liked it, why did they like it? What was their favourite part?







